Superintendents Report

Orchard Primary

It is hard to believe that the 2nd Trimester began on December 2. Student **report cards** were carried home by K-4th grade students on December 6. Like the parent, the teacher's primary aim is the student's well-being and continued improvement. Parents are encouraged to contact the child's teacher if they have any questions or concerns.

This fall we have continued in our efforts to be sure every learner's needs are met. As is federally mandated by IDEA, we utilize the Response to Intervention approach as we intentionally design our programming and structure our school day. Currently **intervention programming** is mainly through multiple pull-outs by utilizing our paraeducators and volunteers. However, our 1st and 4th grade staff has implemented a thirty minute intervention period, four days a week. Students are grouped intentionally, according to deficit areas and receive intentional, targeted intervention from teachers and para-educators. In addition, students will be progress-monitored twice a month and will be grouped and re-grouped according to their gains and/or areas of need.

Developmental Reading Assessment, 2nd edition (DRA2) – Training was provided when staff returned this fall and all teachers will utilize when students return after the holiday break. The DRA2 Benchmark Assessment measures each student's reading proficiency through systematic observation, recording and evaluating of performance. It is a four-step process and pinpoints student's strengths, abilities and needs: Reading Engagement, Oral Reading Fluency, Comprehension and Personalized Instruction. The K-3 staff would like additional kits ordered. Looking for funding!

Check in – Check out is a research based, intervention program for students at risk. The students have daily goals, parent permission and interact daily with an adult (other than their teacher). The coordinator for the program will be S. Calopisis. In addition, two of our specials teachers will receive training in January to become mentors.

The 2nd Annual **Festival of Trees** is taking place in the media center hallway. Each classroom has a display. The students and staff are quite a creative bunch. Please feel free to stop by to recognize their efforts.

iPad Update

Heather Murphy, Carol Purvis, and Kim VonHiltmayer attended the Clintondale "Flipped Classroom" Visit on Dec. 4th. Although a little different than expected, we walked away feeling very fortunate to have the resources that we do at ACS. Both Mrs. Murphy and Mrs. Purvis are ready to attempt the "flipped classroom" model. With our iPad implementation, the iPads could serve as a powerful tool to differentiate instruction and allow the teachers to spend QUALITY time with the students (80/20). Without iPads, it is also possible to implement the "flipped classroom" model; Clintondale does it!
