

Almont Community Schools is asking the community to consider a \$58.4 million bond proposal to **fund additions and updates** to its four campus buildings so that the district can provide Almont students with an **education in a state-of-the-art learning environment optimized to best serve the needs of different learners.**

This bond is expected to reduce the current school millage.

MULTI-PURPOSE CENTER FIELD HOUSE: A VISION FOR THE FUTURE

The proposed Multi-Purpose Center Field House represents **potential revenue-generating space** that **benefits both the school and community**. It would serve as a fitness and music center, host year-round athletics, and offer a dedicated space for the marching band and robotics programs. This facility would be used for competitions and community events.



Multi-Functional Design:

- Intended for a wide array of uses, including sports, academic, and community events
- Offering versatile indoor spaces suitable for various activities



Weather-Resilient Facility:

 Designed to ensure activities and events, including sports practices and large gatherings like graduation ceremonies, are uninterrupted by weather conditions



Revenue Generation:

 The facility would be anticipated to generate significant revenue and would support essential education expenses

Enhanced Safety Measures:

- Additional space would be available for community and club activities, potentially reducing the need for evening access to other school buildings
- Separated location from the main school premises is aimed at enhancing safety, with controlled access



Support for Educational Resources:

 Funds raised would be expected to enhance the general fund, aiding in the provision of teacher salaries, curriculum development, and updated technology
