Student Council

And throughout the evening, the teachers led a wide variety of fun hands-on activities, such as puppet-making stations, shadow puppet retellings, readers' theater activities, and letter-writing. Finally, the night came to an end with an animal magic show by Mark Rosenthal.

TITLE I INTERVENTION

Suzanne Herzog, Melissa Ashbaugh, and Paulynn Bartlett have begun an afterschool reading program for second-, third-, and fourth-grade students. The program is designed to assist ten students in each of these grade levels with reading and writing from now until the end of the year.

KINDERGARTEN ENROLLMENT UPDATE

Kindergarten testing was completed last week. So far registration numbers are as follows: 66 students are registered for Kindergarten, and 21 students have committed to the full-day Begindergarten program.

ANN ARBOR STEAM FIELD TRIP

On Tuesday, March 31, our last snow day, Kris Ruhala, Noelle Graver, Mike Flinn, Liz Kempf, and Jamie Weigand traveled to Ann Arbor to attend a STEAM expo at Northside Elementary. Northside became a full STEAM school last year. It participates in Project Lead the Way, but the staff is also learning to design their own curriculum projects under the guidance of a STEAM coordinator. Once Northside adopted STEAM, its enrollment skyrocketed by 250 students!

Middle School PLC/DCC Update

Overall, the M-STEP Testing is going well at AMS! The teachers and support staff have been extremely helpful and flexible as we adjust to the online testing format. Online testing is conducted in the Computer Lab, Media Center, and the "Overflow Lab" (located across from the office). The AMS PTSA is providing nutritional snacks to all students before the Math and ELA Online Tests. Presently, the 5th and 8th graders are being tested.

STEM Update

A grant has been written and submitted to the Four County Community Foundation; awaiting status. An additional grant will be written to the Lapeer County Community Foundation before June 1st. AMS is interested to pursue curriculum/models from *Project Lead the Way*.

Testing

The M-STEP testing required of all 11th graders has been completed. The M-STEP was the first State of Michigan assessment that was taken completely on the computer. AP testing is scheduled to start soon. Mr. Woelkers will

advise the Board as to the number of students that took the tests along and how they scored when he receives the results.

Scheduling

We are on track to have the master schedule complete by May 2nd. All student requests have been submitted and we are in the process of assigning students to their courses.

Duel Enrollment/Early College

The pilot for duel enrollment through St. Clair Community College has begun. The English Comp class is meeting during 3rd hour each day. It is going very smoothly and the students are working hard. We have had several students select Duel Enrollment as part of their course selection for next school year.

Evaluations

Teacher evaluations are ongoing at the high school. We are in the formal observation portion of the evaluations and will have them all completed by the end of May.

Educational Technology Programs

Many Almont ED TECH students placed at the recent SKILLS USA State competition.

Two students have qualified to move on to the national competition.

Visual and Performing Arts Programs

One student placed second in the High School category of the Michigan Arson Prevention Committee. She will be honored at a luncheon at Weber's Inn, in Ann Arbor, on May 5th.

Early Warning Package Passes House

On Thursday afternoon, the House debated and on voted on House Bills 4325-4330, which create an early warning system for schools in possible fiscal distress. The main bill, HB 4325, was passed by a vote of 60-49. Districts would have to submit their budget assumptions to the state that have less than an 8 percent fund balance and we would be one of these districts. This threshold limits the bill to about 300 school districts.

Bake Sale" Bill Approved by Committee

On Thursday morning, the House Committee on Education passed <u>Senate Bill 139</u>, which would allow for the sale of foods that do not meet federal nutrition guidelines during school hours. Known as the "bake sale" bill, it was passed unanimously by committee and now goes before the full House for its approval. It was amended in committee to limit the number of sales to two per week and require notification to parents that a sale is scheduled.
