Future testing in the Spring at Almont High School

11th Grade Tests in April

The following 3 tests are required by the state of Michigan for all 11th graders and are given in April.

Information from these tests are put on transcripts as required by state law.

- **SAT** is a college entrance test – Digital starting in Spring 2024
- **WorkKeys** tests are a skills assessment. They are usually not used for college entrance, but are sometimes used for job skills assessments for employment beyond high school. This is still Paper/Pencil.

This **is not** the ACT College Entrance Test

- **M-STEP for 11th grade** is a test given by the Michigan Department of Education to evaluate Science and Social Studies. Digital as in past years.
 - M-STEP Science – 90 minutes
 - M-STEP Social Studies – 60 minutes

8th, 9th and 10th Grade Tests – Digital in April

- **PSAT 8/9 and PSAT 10** are grade level SAT tests which are also made available to schools by the Michigan Department of Education for testing in April.
- **8th Grade will also take the M-STEP Science and Social Studies tests in their Science and Social Studies classes.**
 - M-STEP Science – 90 minutes
 - M-STEP Social Studies – 60 minutes
- These scores are not posted on student transcripts, but some are used for accountability with the Michigan Department of Education.
- Data from these tests are used to help with student interventions and assistance with future course assignments.

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What is shown on your high school transcript?

- Your high school grades for grades 9 to 12.
- Your Junior year test scores taken at Almont High School
 - SAT score that for the test you took on the SAT School Day
 - ACT WorkKeys score from School Day testing
 - M-Step Social Studies and Science scores
- Other SAT and ACT Scores

You must request the counseling office to add other SAT or ACT scores to your transcript. They will not be added unless you request them.
- Your transcript is almost always sent to colleges you want to attend.
- Future employers may also request your high school transcript.

ED Tech Schedule for 11th Grade

Room Rosters in the Cafeteria

- Room rosters will be posted on the cafeteria windows about 1 week before testing.
- Find the room you will be testing in and go there at the beginning of testing day.
- Rosters will be the same for 11th grade SAT and WorkKeys testing.
- 11th grade M-STEP testing will have new rosters and must be checked again before M-STEP testing.
- 8th Grade M-STEP testing will take place in your Science and Social Studies classes during your regular class hours.

SAT Testing Schedule for 11th Grade Only

9th, 10th and 12th grades will not attend Almont High School this day

SAT testing will begin at the start of the regular school day and will end around 12:00pm.
11th grade students can leave school after all rooms finish testing.

PSAT 8 Testing Schedule for 8th Grade Only
All Day in School on Wednesday, April 10th
No School on Thursday, April 11th

PSAT 8 testing will begin at the start of the regular school day and will end around 10:15am. Students will go to B Lunch as usual and then stay in school for the entire day. They do not leave early!

**Put cellphones, earbuds, Smartwatches, or any electronic device in your locker.
If you bring a cell phone, we will have it in the front of the room, turned off,
with a sticky note for your name.**

You cannot have a cell phone on you, it must be turned in and turned off.

Eat breakfast before testing!

There will be snacks/waters available in the cafeteria for your break.

You can take your own snack and water to your testing room, but eat them in the cafeteria.

Thursday, April 11th
Testing Schedule for 9th, 10th and 11th Grades

11th grade will take the WorkKeys test

No school for 8th or 12th Grades

See rosters in cafeteria windows.

9th, 10th and 11th grades will stay in school all day, there is no early release.

All tests will begin at the start of the regular school day.

9th and 10th Grades PSAT - Testing ends around 10:15am.

Students will stay in the testing room and then go to their 4th hour class or A lunch as usual.

11th grade WorkKeys finishes around 11am and then will go to B or C lunch.

If you usually have A Lunch, you will go to B Lunch instead and then to the last half of your 4th hour class.

11th Grade WorkKeys testing will use the same rooms that they went to for SAT Testing.

All 9th, 10th and 11th grade students can go to the library for a snack and water for their break.

There is only one snack/water in the library for the first break only in 11th grade WorkKeys testing.



The following week, Tuesday, April 16th 11th Grade M-STEP Testing



11th grade will take 2 M-STEP tests with a test ticket for each

Science - 90 minutes approx.

Social Studies - 60 minutes approx.

Bring your charged Chromebook and your own plugin headphones for testing or we will lend your ours.

Cell phones will be collected at the front of the room with a sticky note for your name or you can put them in your locker. Pencil and scratch paper will be provided. Find your assigned seat by the name on your scrap paper on the desk.

All 11th grade students that don't go to AM Ed Tech will test in the morning at 7:25am.

Morning 11th grade testers will go to their assigned M-STEP testing room at the start of the school day at 7:25, they do not go to their first your class. Morning testing will run until around 10:30am.

Then go to 3rd hour when they finish testing. Exit times will be sent to teachers for attendance.

All AM ED Tech 11th grade will go to ED Tech as usual and then A lunch.

After A lunch, AM ED Tech students go to their assigned rooms for M-STEP testing by 11:09am.

Then go to 6th hour when they finish testing. Exit times will be sent to teachers for attendance.

M-STEP rooms will be different than SAT rooms.

Testing rooms for 11th grade M-STEP testing will be posted on cafeteria windows after SAT and WorkKeys testing is complete.

Exit times will be monitored for all students.

Calculators for the SAT or PSAT

- Follow the Calculator Policy in the Student Guide. Information on acceptable calculators is included.

Calculators are provided within the digital test, but we will provide a physical calculator for you.

- Scientific calculators will be provided for you, or you can bring your own.
- To borrow a graphing calculator please see Mr. Leusby, Mr. Bacholzky or Mr. Voyt. You should only use a graphing calculator if you are familiar with using one.

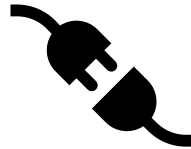

Students will take the digital SAT on a custom-built digital exam application.



If the internet disconnects during testing, students will still be able to progress through the test with no disruption.



If a student's device runs out of battery, they can simply plug in, restart their device, and pick up where they left off—all their work will be saved, and they won't lose testing time.

Bluebook automatically locks out other programs to ensure students cannot cheat.

Students are timed individually. If their start times are slightly staggered, their breaks and end times will be too.



Students will take the digital SAT on a custom-built digital exam application.

Along with access to full-length digital SAT practice tests and test preview, Bluebook provides all students with the following tools during testing:

The Reading and Writing section is 64 minutes.

The Math section is 70 minutes.

Each section is composed of two equal-length modules of test questions.

Students can navigate among questions within a module

Each Reading/Writing module lasts 32 minutes.

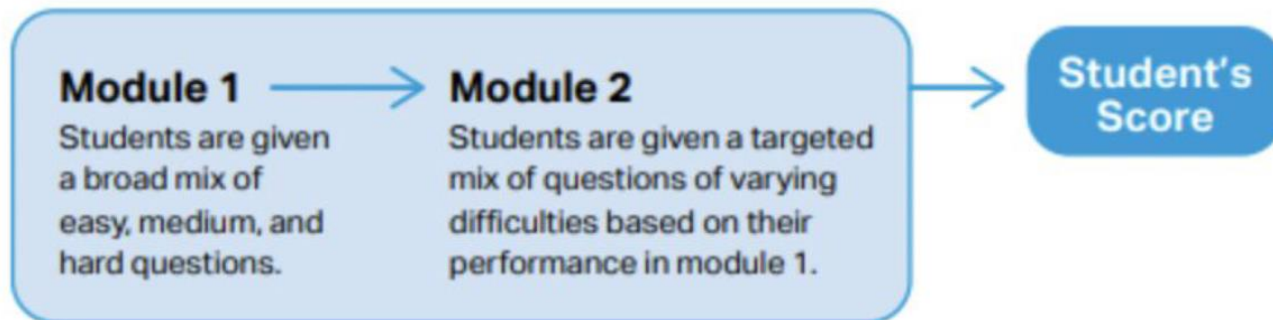
Each Math module lasts 35 minutes.

For 11th Grade SAT with Essay, students have **50 minutes** to complete the additional Essay.

Module 1 will use questions to assess your level

Module 2 will be geared to your level of questions based on Module 1.

It is really important to do your best on Module 1 to improve your score and get your highest level of questions on Module 2. Both of these items can improve your score.



How is the Digital PSAT or SAT is Scored

- Paper/Pencil SAT and PSAT scored simply based on whether a question was right or wrong.

Since the digital PSAT and SAT use the modules to determine question levels, the digital tests are scored differently.

- All test questions are scored as correct or incorrect. Students won't lose points for guessing, so they should try to answer every question.
- The difficulty level and other qualities of each question (such as how well it differentiates skill level or how easy it is to guess on a question)— as well as whether the student got the question right or wrong—are taken into account when calculating a student's score.
- No points are subtracted for incorrect answers or answers left blank.
- That score is then converted to the reported score.

Answer every question!

- An empty answer is always wrong so try to answer every question.

On Test Day

- Bring only your charged Chromebook to the room. Leave everything else, including your cell phone, smartwatch or any other electronic device in your locker.
- You can bring a water bottle/snack to put under your desk, but it can only be used during your 10 minute break.
- You will have your ticket, 3 pieces of scratch paper, a calculator and pencil at your desk.

When Section 1 Reading/Writing is complete, you will get a break.

Do not close your Chromebook!

- You cannot finish a section early; You must wait until the section time is up.
- You will wait until all students in the room are at their break time. Please wait quietly.
- Your break will be 10 minutes and come back to the room to begin Section 2.
- You cannot go to your locker during break.

When Section 2 Math is Complete

Do not close your Chromebook!

The proctor will check to see the CONGRATULATIONS screen.

Please wait quietly until all students finish testing.

- The proctor/teacher will collect your scratch paper and test tickets.
- Wait quietly until the proctor/teacher dismisses you from the room.
 - Your submitted test must be verified by your proctor/teacher.

Reminders for Test Day

- **Charge your Chromebook fully before the test. It must be charged to be used for at least 3 hours.** We do not have enough Chromebooks or chargers to lend for many people. If yours is not charged, you may have to test on a makeup day.
- **Put your turned-off cell phone, Smartwatches, Fit Bit, earbuds, headphones and other electronic devices in your locker before the test.** You cannot have any type of headphone unless you are approved for one for an accommodation. If you bring any device into the testing room, it will be collected before the test. If you use your cell phone or other electronic device during your test, your test may be disqualified.
- **See the cafeteria windows for your assigned testing room.**
- **Be on time on test day.** If you are late on test day, you may have to make up your test on another day if testing has already started in the classrooms. Testing starts at the beginning of first hour.
- **No hats or hoods on in the testing room.**
- **Please take advantage of breakfast in the school cafeteria or eat at home before school.**
- **You cannot go to your locker at any time during testing and not during your break.**
- **Think about dressing in layers** and wearing a sweatshirt, sweater or jacket in case it gets cold or warm in a room. We **cannot** let you go to your locker later.

Reminders for Test Day

- **Breaks for a room will be given when all students have finished Section One.** Please wait quietly until all in the room are ready for a break. You will see a timer for your break, but you may continue the break after the timer for break ends.
- **Other breaks during the test will not stop the clock in a section unless you have an accommodation for extra breaks.**
- **You can have a water and a snack only during your break. You cannot use your water during the test.** You may bring your own water and snack. We will provide a water bottle and snack in the library during your break.
- **The proctor will collect all scratch paper when the test is complete. Scratch paper cannot leave the testing room.**
- **Grades 8, 9 and 10 - Testing should finish before lunch. If it runs past your lunchtime, you will be given time to eat lunch and then will go to your next scheduled class.**
- **11th grade only – After taking the SAT with Essay, you will be able to leave school for the day. If you don't have a ride home, you must notify the office at least 2 weeks before test day that you need a bus ride home.**
- **Pencils, scratch paper and calculators will be provided for you. There is also an embedded calculator provided within all of the College Board SAT and PSAT tests for the Math section after your break. Calculators should remain under your desk for the ELA section and should only be used for the Math section.**

Practice Now in the Bluebook App

Make sure you first log out of your Chromebook.
You cannot be signed in.

Select the box of squares  **Apps** from the bottom left of the Chromebook.

Use your test ticket to log into Bluebook to setup and try a practice test.
You must use capital letters if they are on your ticket. Make sure zeros are numbers.

You will do exam setup. They will ask a series of questions. The only item you should fill in is your school email. Do not give your phone number, parent information or answer other questions. These questions are optional and you must have parent permission to fill them in.

Digital Readiness Check

- Select Test Your Device in the top right corner
- Exam Setup – Only enter your school email address when asked.
- Only provide your phone number or other personal information if you have a parent permission slip signed and returned to the the school. Skip these optional fields if you have not turned in that form.
- Don't opt in to any apps unless you have returned the parent permission slip.
- Select Start Exam Setup
- Select Test Preview – Try out the tools

- If you take the SAT test multiple times, colleges will usually use your best composite score for entrance. GPA is also used for college entrance and often uses academic classes only to determine entrance. For example, PE classes would not be used for your college entrance GPA.
- Students who meet college readiness benchmarks have a 50% chance of earning a B or better grade and a 75% chance of earning a C or better grade in a corresponding college course.

Register early to take the test at a location near you! Seats fill up fast!

You Can Take the ACT College Entrance Test

- Although our school is not administering the ACT, you can still take the ACT at another time in another location.
- Many schools are suggesting that you take the ACT test also. This test will not be provided by our school and you will have to pay for it. Fee waivers are available for free or reduced lunch students. Please stop by the counseling office for a fee waiver form.
- If you take the ACT test multiple times, colleges will use your best composite score for entrance. Some colleges will use your “Super Score”, which is the best score in each area of the ACT. Of students who retake the ACT, 55% will earn a higher score, 23% will earn a lower score, and 22% will stay the same.
- Log on to www.act.org to register if you would like to take the ACT test.
- You will not have to take the ACT Plus Writing because your SAT writing can be used for college entrance. You may register for ACT No Writing instead.
- ACT College Entrance Recommendations
- Recommended minimum ACT Scores for college entrance:

English	18
Math	22
Reading	21
Science	24
- Colleges minimally like a Composite score of 18.
- The average Almont High School composite score has been 20.1
- ACT Testing Dates
- Off-site ACT Testing that requires a fee can be found at www.act.org. Some dates are as follows. You must register online for these tests. ACT will show you locations for these test dates, they are NOT offered at Almont High School.

Look at Your Past Scores

- For students that took a PSAT test in October or in past years, your results should be available.

- **Your username should be your email address. In the past we have recommended your password be your school password with the last character doubled.**
- New students might not have an account and will have to create one if they have not created one before by selecting Sign Up. Then you will have to enter information about yourself to create an account. For new students your username will be your email address.

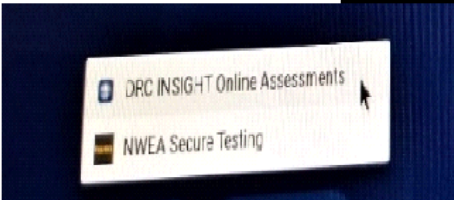
