How Did My Score Measure Against the Benchmarks?

Section scores report scores in performance zones that indicate whether you are on track to meet the college readiness benchmarks on the SAT[®].

For section scores

Need to Strengthen Skills = below grade-level benchmark by more than one year

Approaching Benchmark = below grade-level benchmark by one year or less

Meets or Exceeds Benchmark = at or above grade-level benchmark

The red, yellow, and green ranges in the test scores and subscores reflect areas of strengths and weaknesses compared to the typical performance of students.

The public universities in Michigan classify students who complete college-level work prior to receiving their high school diploma as entering freshmen. Early/Middle College students are considered entering freshmen even if an associate's degree is earned prior to high school graduation.
